


NCZC (Northern CA Zoroastrian Center) UPDATE




Breakdown of the survey results by Community Support and Contribution Levels

Young Voice, Deep Roots: Fifth Grader Speaks on his Parsi Heritage

A young member of our community, Jahan V. (10), recently wrote a short speech for his humanities class on identity and its impact on the community. He chose to highlight his Parsi roots and his love of food, and how the two connect. We thank his mom, Dilnavaz Bamboat, for sharing his beautiful work with us below:



Could you imagine that two of my identities converge at an interesting point in history more than 1,300 years ago? I am the descendant of the Persians that arrived in India, called the Parsis. Parsis are historically great lovers of the culinary arts, so these are my two main identities. Parsi cuisine is frequently called "magpie cooking". Just as a magpie brings various items to feather its nest, this cuisine blends multiple cultures and histories to form its unique taste. In loving and appreciating my history and culture, I am brought closer to my roots and community. Enjoying our traditional meals brings the community together in joy and belonging, so far away from our home countries of India and Iran. As a food lover with a diverse palate, I hope to encourage other children to be adventurous and try out new foods and culinary traditions and experiences. At the end of this month, the community in the Bay Area will organize an entirely free and volunteer-run feast, and I can't wait to attend and enjoy both my identities!

This enterprising couple began their journey in the U.S. in 2000 at the Indian Consulate in San Francisco, where they assisted countless Zoroastrians and members of the Bay Area Indian Community with visas, passports, OCIs and many other challenges.

While working full-time, they raised two accomplished children: daughter Sherezad, an entrepreneur, and

son Eric, an executive chef. Over the years, the Mistrys established a thriving catering business that brought delectable Parsi cuisine to private homes, celebrations and community events alike. Their generosity extended far beyond business, as they selflessly volunteered their time and culinary talents for numerous ZANC events. The entire community always enjoyed and looked forward to the delectable Dhansak prepared and donated by them at several Ghambars.

In 2014, they were instrumental in preparing and donating the scrumptious Lagan-nu-Bhonu for a fundraiser which was a resounding success and raised funds for a new community center. This was followed by a second fundraiser in 2016 where they volunteered to prepare the entire banquet again for the NCZC funds. In recognition of their unwavering service, they were honored with the "Volunteer of the Year" Award that same year. morning of music, art, and fun conversations to uplift your soul.









Showcasing Award Winning Author Thrity Umrigar

October is celebrated as National Book Month - a time to honor the joy of reading and the power of storytelling. We take this opportunity to shine a light on a Parsi author whose works have inspired, educated and connected readers across generations.

<u>Thrity Umrigar</u> is an Indian-American journalist, critic, and a best-selling author of eleven <u>novels</u>, three <u>children's books</u>, and a <u>memoir</u>.

Thrity was born in Bombay into a Parsi family and received a BSc from Bombay University. She came to the US when she was 21 for graduate studies. In 1983, she earned a MA in journalism from Ohio State University, after which worked for 17 years as a reporter, columnist and magazine writer. She also earned her Ph.D in English from Kent State University in 1997and in 2001 she wrote her first novel, *Bombay Time*.

In 2002, she accepted a teaching position as Professor of English at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, where she still teaches today, all while continuing her love of writing novels. Her books have been translated into several languages and published in over fifteen countries while her articles have been published in prestigious publications such as *The New York Times*, the *Washington Post* and the *Boston Globe*.

Thrity is an active presence on the national lecture circuit, speaking at book festivals, literary societies and public libraries all across the country. In her in-depth <u>interviews</u> and engaging <u>book chat</u> with fellow authors, she often highlights the Parsi influences that shape her works.

Editor's Note: I recently had the pleasure of hearing Thrity on a panel at the SALA 2025 event at Menlo College, CA, last month, where she spoke eloquently about how her Parsi upbringing in Bombay shaped her life and how that unique culture continues to be reflected in her books (holding her book *Sugar in Milk*).


